



A multi-megaton-range thermonuclear weapon known as the H-Bomb.




Sugar Ray

that halted the Korean War was signed.




Marlon Brando became a top movie actor nominated for the Academy Award

The Catcher in the Rye


A novel by J. D. Salinger was an extreme

Queen Elizabeth II succeeded to the throne of the United Kingdom




Marciano

and arrested many Hungarians.




Alabama

Chou En-Lai


Sputnik

An Academy Award winning movie






Lebanon

The Brooklyn Dodgers baseball team moved to Los Angeles.



A national fad, which became a craze, peaked and died out quickly.




Castro

A thriller movie directed by Alfred Hitchcock




Congo gained independence from Belgium

Former Nazi leader Adolf Eichmann was convicted of war crimes and executed.




Singer Bob Dylan led the folk music craze.

British rock group "The Beatles" took over the music scene, with numerous hit records.




John Glenn

Boxer Sonny Liston defeated



Woodstock The biggest rock concert ever held.






